

COST MANAGEMENT, CERTIFICATE

The Certificate is designed to complement graduate degree programs offered within the Moore School of Business. Note: A student may pursue the certificate simultaneously with pursuing other graduate degrees in business and students are allowed to use up to 9 credit hours taken as part of the certificate for degree requirements. Students who earn a certificate and then enroll in a degree program may also use up to 9 credit hours from the certificate toward the completion of degree requirements, provided the degree is awarded within four years of the completion of the certificate.
