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The Family Nurse Practitioner program (FNP) program prepares registered nurses to provide direct patient management in primary care across the lifespan in many settings. Graduates are employed in a variety of primary care settings ranging from emergency departments, federally qualified health centers, urban and rural family practice/primary care practices.

This curriculum prepares registered nurses to sit for the appropriate national certification examination upon completion of their degree and graduation.
