Certificate Requirements

The Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Certificate is 15 credit hours. Students are required to take three core courses (9 credits) and two electives (6 credits) which are selected from an approved list. Students currently enrolled in another degree program at USC may share up to 12 credit hours between both programs. The MCH Certificate Program Director and your faculty mentor will assist you in elective course selection and course sequencing.
