

HEALTH SERVICES POLICY AND MANAGEMENT, M.H.A.

The M.H.A. program prepares students for a career in the management of the full range of programs, organizations, and facilities in health services and medical care: acute, post-acute, long-term, and managed care, in the public and private sectors. The M.H.A. is offered in a full-time format (traditional track, 58 credit hours). Additionally, professionals working in health care organizations may complete the program through an executive track (45 credit hours) with courses held on weekends once per month.

1. Students will be able to apply Critical Thinking, Analysis, and Problem-Solving competencies to health services organizations.
2. Students will be able to apply Management and Leadership competencies to health services/organizations.
3. Students will be able to apply Communications and Interpersonal Effectiveness competencies to health services organizations.

5. Students will be able to apply Population Health Management competencies to health services planning and management, including social determinants of health.
