TRAUMA-INFORMED PRACTICE, CERTIFICATE

The Trauma-Informed Practice (TIP) Certificate is an 18-credit, graduatelevel, cross disciplinary certificate offered through the USC College of Social Work. The certificate will provide cutting edge, specialized trauma knowledge and the development of practice skills in trauma intervention across a range of practice areas.

Learning Outcomes

- 1. Students will demonstrate competent knowledge of trauma in neuroscientific research and practice.
- 2. Students will demonstrate knowledge of trauma-informed practice principles and their intersection with human rights and anti-racist frameworks, applied to diverse individuals, families, and communities, including those who have experienced racism and oppression.
- Students will demonstrate practice skills in the areas of traumainformed engagement and assessment, trauma-sensitive relationship building, and trauma-responsive interventions across diverse populations and settings.
- 4. Students will demonstrate capacity to develop trauma-informed policies and practices in and between various organizations, institutions, and systems people encounter, including education, child welfare, criminal justice, health and mental health, substance use, and others.
- 5. Students will competently apply knowledge about the impact of personal and collective, secondary, and vicarious exposure to trauma, engage in ethical decision-making that addresses the potential risk for harm in helping relationships, and develop self-care and relational support practices.

Admissions Criteria

It is each applicant's responsibility to ensure that all required application materials are received. Applicants should list the Graduate Certificate in Trauma-Informed Practice on the application under degree pursued. The program accepts applications on a rolling basis.

Currently Enrolled Students in the Master of Social Work Program

Students in good academic standing may request concurrent enrollment. Interested students must contact the program coordinator to review the application process.

Other Applicants

Applicants not currently enrolled in the Master of Social Work program, must submit the following for full consideration:

- 1. A completed application with all requested information and supporting documents supplied.
- Official transcripts showing all college-level course work attempted and the award of the baccalaureate or higher degree from an accredited college or university.
- 3. At least two letters of recommendation
- 4. International applicants whose native language is not English are also required to submit a satisfactory score on an approved language proficiency test. See International Students and Credentials (https://
