

# FOREIGN LANGUAGE EDUCATION MINOR

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The foreign language education minor is available to students majoring in French, German, Spanish or Classics (Latin). As part of the four-year Foreign Language Teacher Certificate\* program, students complete courses in diversity of learning, trends in teaching and teaching foreign languages, and other curriculum relevant to Pre-K through Grade-12 education. Graduates who successfully complete the overall program, which includes two semesters of internships, will be certified to teach their major language for these grades. Students also have the option to extend their studies to obtain a Masters in Teaching through additional requirements.
