Students in the Chinese studies minor will take courses in Mandarin while examining the social and historical aspects of Chinese culture, literature, politics and religion. Students will learn from professors whose interests range from Tang Dynasty poetry and Chinese linguistics to Taiwanese pop music and contemporary Chinese cinema.
